The "VooDoo Idol" was created by Voodoo Larry in 2008 as a tribute car to Gene Winfield, an American automotive









customizer and fabricator whose car designs caught the attention of the film community and were featured in several movies. The car is a compilation of car parts from many different types of vehicles. It is truly unique! The hand formed panels echo the craftsmanship of a bygone era. The rear window is the ONLY part that wasn't modified!

The custom car features the front bumper from a 1949 Cadillac, the front grill from a 1947 Studebaker, the steering wheel from a 1946 Lincoln Zephyr. the fender skirts from a 1941 Buick, the ront sub frame/drive train from a 1981 Chevy Camaro, the frame from a 1946 Ford, tail lamps from a 1949 Plymouth, and the rear bumper from a 1949 Cadil-
