



Everyone in attendance stood and applauded after Lissa read the inscription. Afterwards, Lissa thanked all of the officers and many club members for their help during her years as President.

The CT Seaport Car Club is very pleased to announce the appointment of its newest Board Members for the 2-year term of 2026-2027. Six members of the club were sworn into office at the December 17th, 2025 monthly meeting at Port 5, the National Association of Naval Veterans, in Bridgeport. Originally founded in 2009 by Mark Milosky and team, the CT Seaport Car Club is now in its 17th year. Lissa Seeberger was the 3rd President of the Club, the first female President, and she held the position for 4 years (2022-2025). Prior to Lissa, Dean Radcliffe was President for a 2-year term (2020-2021) and Mark Milosky was the President for the first 11 years (2009-2020).



When asked about his new post, Sal said "I'm honored to step into the role of President of the CT Seaport Car Club. Our focus is on preserving automotive history, growing participation, and strengthening the sense of community. Whether you own a classic or simply enjoy car culture, the CT Seaport Car Club is about bringing people together through a shared passion."

There are almost 150 car enthusiasts from Fairfield County on the roster of the very active CT Seaport Car Club. In addition to having monthly meetings,

the club has 2 cruises per month between May and October at either Elicit Brewing Company (111 Black Rock Turnpike, Fairfield on the first Thursday of the month) or Port 5 (69 Brewster St, Bridgeport on the third Thursday of the month), will have a major car show on Sunday, June 7th, 2026 at Fairfield Ludlowe High School, marches in the Fairfield Memorial Day Parade (Monday, May 25th, 2026), marches in the Southport Blessing of the Fleet (Saturday, June 13th, 2026), and helps out at several other car shows.

The first of our events in 2026 are the car cruise at Elicit Brewing Company on Thursday, May 7th, 2026 at 5:00-8:00pm and then Thursday, May 21, 2026 at Port 5 also at 5:00-8:00pm. These cruises have produced about 50 cars each on Thursday nights in the past.

The 33rd Annual Terryville Bug-A-Fair will be held on Father's Day June 21th, 2026 at the Terryville Lions Fairgrounds 171 Town Hill Rd. Terryville CT 06786 from 9am to 3:30pm.



Last year was our biggest turnout yet with 50+ campers Saturday night, 400 show cars, 80+ swap meet vendors, and over 1800 spectators on Sunday. Our best attendance ever!

Show car registration begins at 9am, judging starts sharply at 12 noon and awards ceremony will begin by 3:30pm. The show also has a huge swap meet with vendors selling new and used parts, toys, and t-shirts and automobilia. If you're looking for that special hard to find part or need to unload some of your extra VW stuff this is the place to be at!

There are 40 show classes with 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place awards for both Air-Cooled and Water-Cooled VW's plus 21 Special Awards and Best of Show Trophies for Air-Cooled Stock, Air-Cooled Custom, and Water-Cooled.

Cars are judged using a point system based on condi-

tion of Exterior, Interior, Chassis/Pan, Engine, Trunk Area, and Display (optional). Please have your hoods and deck lids open for judges to get a good look at your VW. Convertibles, please have your tops up in closed position.

Breakfast, lunch, and beverages will be available for purchase all day Sunday provided by the Terryville Lions Club. All proceeds go to the Terryville Lions Club.

There's plenty of camping space available Saturday night for those who want to circle their wagen's. Fairground bathrooms will be available to campers throughout the night. All campfires must be contained.

space plus \$35 for camping (includes electrical hook up). No vendors after 9pm will be allowed in swap area. NO EXCEPTIONS!

*Please do not drive into show field area Saturday afternoon as we are busy setting up the show. Please do not arrive before 2pm Saturday. The gate for campers and early vendors will open at 2pm. Thank you for your cooperation.

There is no selling on the show field do not put items for sale out near your vehicle a swap space must be bought to sell in designated area.

* Friendly leashed dogs are permitted but must be tended to. Please pick-up after your pooch!

* Entrance to show is cash only but food may be purchased electronically, a ATM is onsite

* Camping area gate will open Saturday afternoon at 2pm. Please do not show up before then. DO NOT DRIVE INTO THE SHOW FIELD AT ALL ON SATURDAY! Lions Club will be Saturday evening to collect camping fee, \$20 per vehicle.
